Culvert Replacements

Fish passage barrier removals open habitat for spawning and rearing by:

- installing bridge and fish friendly culverts
- removing dams and tide gates
- decommissioning roads



Rivers & Streams

Improve and increase habitat by:

- installing wood structures
- reconnecting floodplains
- reintroducing complexity
- creating pools and spawning areas
- restoring floodplain forests



Nearshore & Estuarine

Increase nearshore habitat for juvenile salmon by:

- improving fish passage
- restoring estuaries
- removing bulkheads
- improving beaches

Education & Outreach

Increasing public awareness by:

- coordinating tours of the Kennedy Creek Salmon Trail
- presenting salmon curriculum in classrooms of all ages
- providing salmon friendly property management consultations
